
CELEBRATING EUROPE DAY WITH PRIMARY SCHOOL CHILDREN

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
Individual Activities

Write a short story about Europe, what does it mean to you, which country would you like to know more about and why






Make models of European landmarks








Individual Activities

Learn how to count in other languages

Learn simple day to day words

Look at differing time zones and weather patterns



Design a poster for a European country

Design your own European flag



Create a comic with the EU as the main topic

Group Activities



Start a European map marking the children's holiday destinations. What was different from home?



Video conference with children in another European country



Calculate distances from your school to different European capitals

Play maths games using the Euro

Look at packaging - is it made in Europe and where?





Check the newspapers for European news

Produce a collage with scenes from across Europe, using postcards, food labels, brochures and recipes









Group Activities

Decorate each classroom as a different country

Learn about how the other member states celebrate traditional events; Christmas in Germany, 14th July in France, Easter in Greece/Spain, Guy Fawkes in UK, St. Stephen's Day in Hungary, Midsummer's day in Estonia, St. Patricks Day in Ireland, Boxing










Listen to the music of great classical composers and find out where they lived and where they performed:
Handel is German, but lived in Italy and in England. How about Mozart?

Day in Finland

Create a European icon memo game. Cut out pictures of well known European landmarks or personalities, photocopy and use as pairs of cards in a memory game





Group Activities

Create a Europe notice board/display

Sing popular songs in different languages and translations; like Silent Sing traditional songs from other countries





Find out about popular singers in other member states: who is popular today in France? the national anthems of other EU member states What does he/she sing?

Guess who is the leader? Learn about the

President/King/Queen/Prime Minister of other member states, ask questions and create riddles so other pupils can guess who they are

Children could pinpoint on map of the EU the countries where they have already been to and what they found was different from the UK, what they liked, what they disliked



Chinese whispers learn a simple sentence in a foreign language, sit in a circle, whisper it to your neighbour and pass it on









Design a time line of European history to be displayed in the classroom. Children could look for information and pictures to illustrate the time line

School Activities



Set up a European café in school using Euros or arrange a European lunch provided by the canteen or school children









Children could dress in the colours of the flag of different European countries



Email children in a partner school asking them how they are celebrating Europe Day





Art from across Europe

Gaudi in Spain, Impressionism from France, Van Gogh from the Netherlands Invite foreign nationals to speak in class or assembly



School Activities







What do other Europeans eat for breakfast? Prepare a European breakfast at school











Act out scenes from classic theatre plays



Organise a market or festival with European traditions, food or dances



Create theme posters: e.g. design a poster with animals and write the name of the animals in different languages

Ask children from European backgrounds in the class to talk about their experiences - what do they find different about living in the UK, what do they like, what do they dislike?
